SACRAMENTO INJECTS \$230,000 INTO CAMP LASSEN

2015 brought many amazing improvments to our beautiful Camp. Thanks to an impressive infusion of \$230,000 from the Golden Empire Council (G.E.C.) in Sacramento, and

summer fun! Under the new leadership of Golden Empire Council Executive Charles Brasfield. critical steps have been taken to upgrade the camp's program, facilities and infrastructure. Following is a brief run-down:

New Scoutcraft Camp Cooking Facility and HQ

For many, the phrase "Boy Scout



cookout" means little more than a classic wiener roast. In truth, however, camp cooking is an art form with everincreasing levels of sophistication.

Despite its rustic, outdoor charm, Camp's historic Scoutcraft area has lacked the space, tools, and sanitary environment to conduct outdoor cooking lessons on a large scale. Additionally, only a fraction of the requirements for Cooking Merit Badge (offered at the Scoutcraft area) specifically relate to outdoor cooking.

..... The rest more general in nature, needing and the sanitary environment to conduct piles of standard equipment, pantry space and refrigeration.

> Thanks to a core of volunteers provided by the Alumni Association - Jim Thorup, Dave Dion, Dave Burkland, Dale Staddleman and many others - we've performed a massive overhaul to the old bike shed (formerly, the trading post and nature lodge) which is now home to a large indoor food prep and outdoor cooking center.

New Bouldering Wall and Climbing Center Renovation

Camp Lassen is now equipped with state-of-the-art "bouldering" experience near the lodge, and an amazing 32-foot multi-skill climbing wall above the C.O.P.E. course. The bouldering structure, made possible with generous contributions of manpower and expertise from Pat Conroy Construction of Chico, lies in close proximity to the Main Lodge and parade grounds. Accessible to anyone passing by or hanging out, the 12 x 20-foot structure is equipped

with hundreds of low-elevation rock attachments - a great down-time calorie-burner.

For those seeking an even bigger adrenaline rush, camp now offers a massively upgraded 3-story Wall Climbing Center, largely donated by Kurt Carman, owner of BCM

Construction.



The new wall features multiple courses tailored to different skill levels, including some totally boss, inverted "pop-out" features. The cub climbing section has been moved around the corner to a different side of the tower, which is now rounded out with a fresh coat of paint, new trim, and clear fiberglass siding for natural lighting on the interior. It's righteous.

Introducing New Council Executive Chuck Brasfeild

Restroom Renovations

When campers gotta go, campers gotta go. That's why Uriah Bakke, a multi-generational Camp Lassen enthusiast and owner of Precision Construction, "toi-leted" away for weeks-on-end in preparation for the summer flushing season. The focus of his efforts was a total overhaul of the North and South restrooms, which he has equipped with new private showers, wainscoting, counter tops and all new fixtures. Seeing is believing, and this summer if you're up camp-way you should think of a reason to trot on over and "go to it." No binder's twine here.

New Dock!

This summer we inherited new docks from Camp Pahatsi, which sadly suffered severe fire damage ten years ago. While much-loved, Lassen's old wooden docks had one foot in the grave and the other on



a banana peel. The much-newer 10 x 60foot Pahatsi dock, which was waterlogged and partially sunk, received a complete donated overhaul from Thomas Welding in Chico. It is now the best dock Camp Lassen has ever floated (Thanks, Tom!). Also, this project could never have happened were it not for George Wurlitzer Farms, which hauled all the dock sections from the central Sierras off I-80 to Butte Meadows.

Nature Center Renovation

Once a hangout for bespectacled butterfly chasers and riparian nymph



aficionados, the Nature Lodge – and the badges that are taught there – have become central to Scouting's mission in the 21st century. Simply put, the building we have been using as a HQ for the Nature Program was not up to the broad-based task. Today, the old lodge on the edge of the meadow has been renovated inside and out, thanks to efforts by Ren Wakefield and the Alumni Association volunteer corps.

MAIN LODGE REPORT

As you are all well aware, the Lassen Lodge was in desperate need of repairs seven years ago, when the Alumni Association and broader community pulled together to raise funds and manpower for critical repairs. All told, through our 75th Anniversary capital campaign, we were able to raise \$32,000! Here is a list of improvements that will help ensure the survival and continued viability of this one-of-a-kind regional treasure that we call our own:

- New footings to replace the rotten ones.
- Skirting replacement around the Main Lodge.
- Releveled the Lodge Floor with 120 new concrete footings and posts.
- Bridged a massive old "stove pit" underneath with I-joists, new beams and posts.
- Repaired the sections of floor around the posts that hold up the roof.
